- Jan 1924 – >2 years before ‘scienti-fiction’ –
- ‘Pulp’ Genre story by S. African writer
- ‘The man who banished himself’ (Weird Tales, v 3, 1) Ferdinand Berthoud; issue included a Lovecraft tale.
- Webbed Hands (Strange Tales cover story; December 1931)

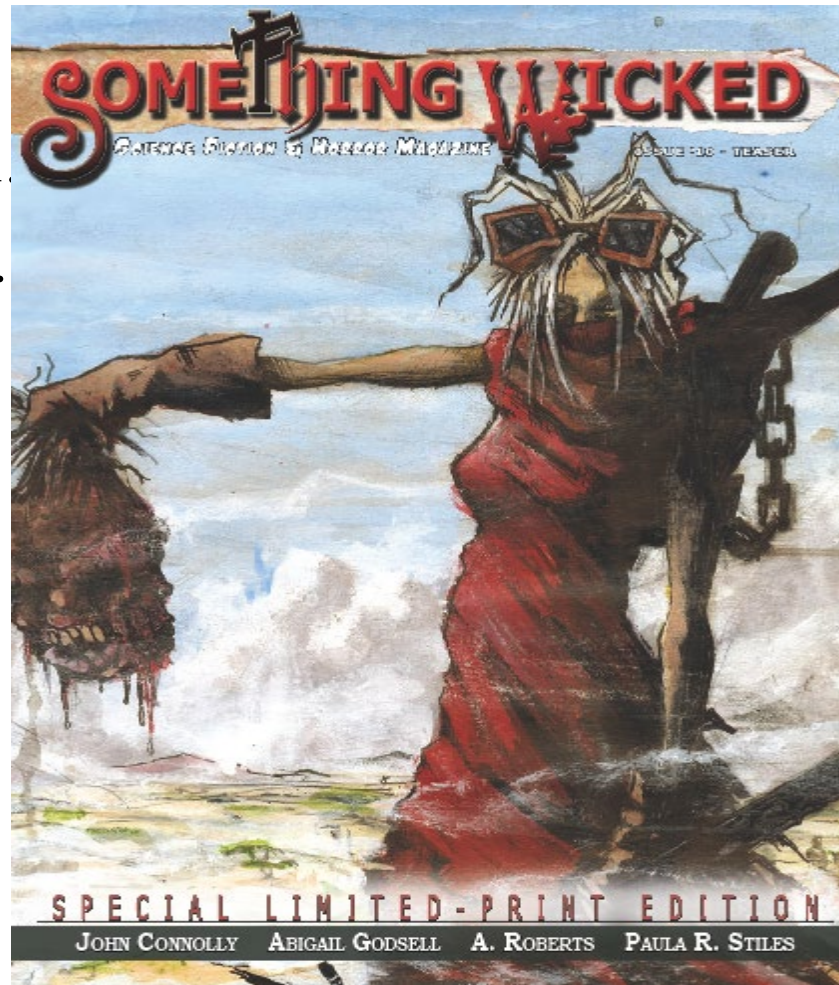

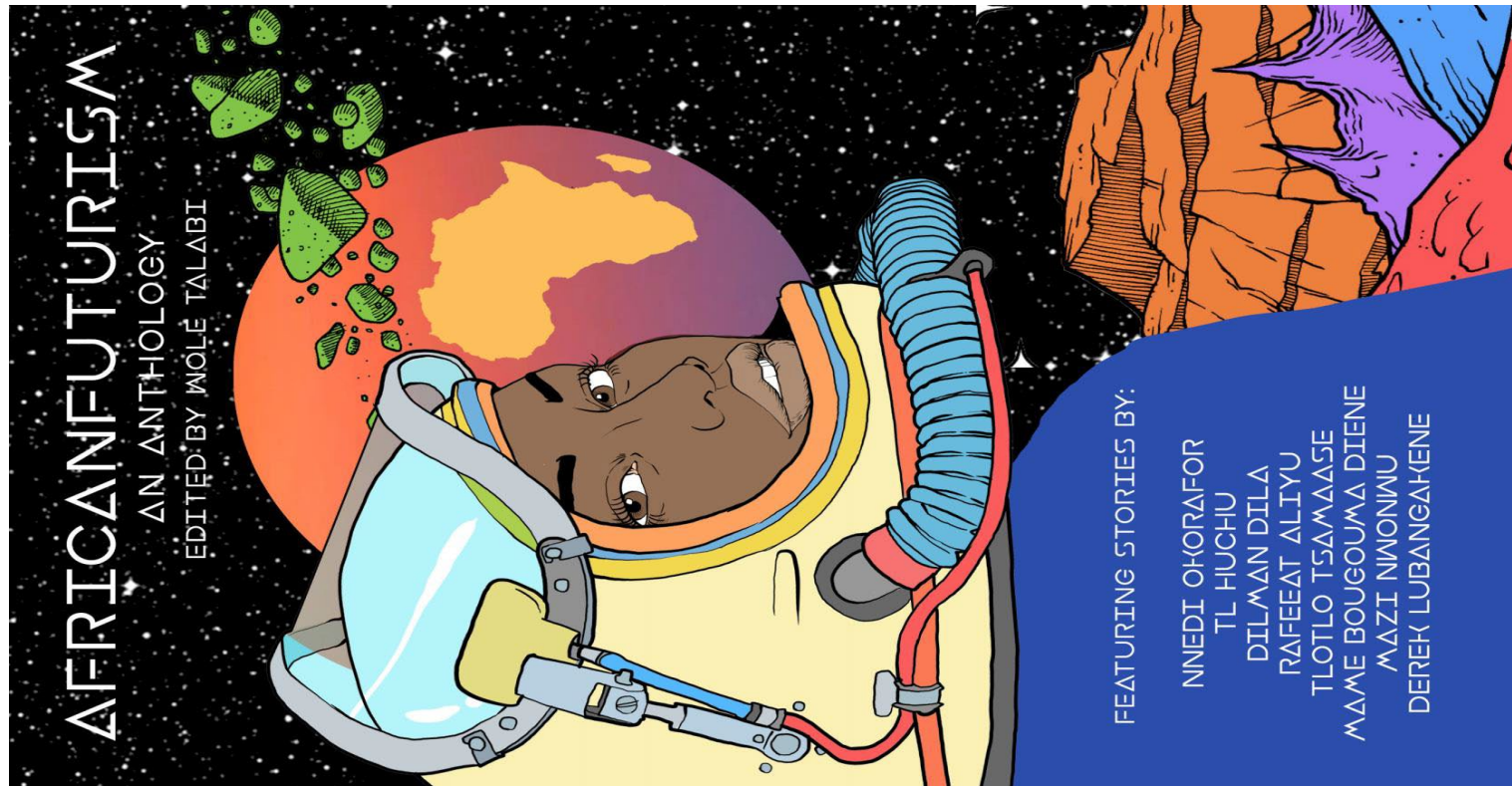

10 African SF Rec's (Focus)

- 1. Point of View: **Kgebetli Moele – *The Book of the Dead*** (2010). A human narrator for the first half of Book of the Dead: in the Book of the Living. A personified HIV Virus narrates the middle and end, for the Book of the Dead.
- 2. Idea/Theme: **Tade Thompson – *The Wormwood Trilogy*** (2018-19). A vertiginous, yet grittily visceral exploration of alien invasion and survival. '*But we're still here.*'
- 3. Language: **Eugen M. Bacon - *Ivory's Story*** (2020). Language shifts, slides, and swings, in this vivid African- Australian Aboriginal melange of a novella.
- 4. Plot. **Zakes Mda – *The Whale Caller*** (2005). This plot does not follow the steep three acts of a Western plot structure. Enjoy, instead, a calm but complex meditation on life and loving (across species too) in the Southernmost parts of Africa. Learn and follow, **My Octopus Teacher** (Netflix).

- **5. Short Stories:** A feast of delights from **AfroSF 1** (2012) to **Dominion** (2020) and from **Nnedi Okorafor's *Kabu Kabu*** (2013) to **Shanice Ndlovu's *The Pride of Noonlay*** (2020) For smart purist SF, however, my pick is **Wole Talabi's *Incomplete Solutions*** (2019).
- **6. Queer & Non-Binary:** **Innocent Chizaram Ilo – various**. Their works interrogate gender, class, politics, and sexuality. They were the regional winner for Africa of the *2020 Commonwealth Short Story Prize* for their short story “*When a Woman Renounces Motherhood*.” And **Akwaeke Emezi** – see books, stories, and essays here: <https://www.akwaeke.com/>
- **7. Film:** **Dilman Dila - *Her Broken Shadow***. A smart East African SF tale, beautifully scripted and filmed, despite a low budget. Read **Dilman's** account at the Mithila Review (2017): https://mithilareview.com/dila_04_17/
- **8. Heads Up One:** **Tendai Huchu - *The Library of the Dead*** (February 2021): *Ropa* dropped out of school to become a ghostalker – but she now speaks to Edinburgh's dead, carrying messages to the living. First in the Edinburgh Nights series.

To 'Ten'...

- 9. Heads Up Two: **Chikodili Emelumadu** – Dazzling (2021): Treasure, a young girl who has lost her father and is taken in by a spirit, finds her life intertwined with Ozoemena, another girl who becomes part of a Nigerian Leopard Society --- whose members are normally men. For updates, follow @chemelumadu
- 10. Champion: **Geoff Ryman** – various hugely supportive contributions. His 100 African Writers of SFF is an ongoing, BSFA Award winning epic, at Strange Horizons. My pick, however, is Geoff's curated compilation within The Manchester Review 18 (2017)

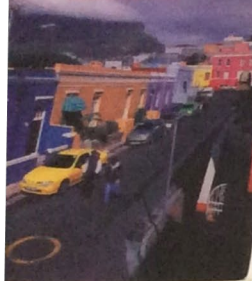

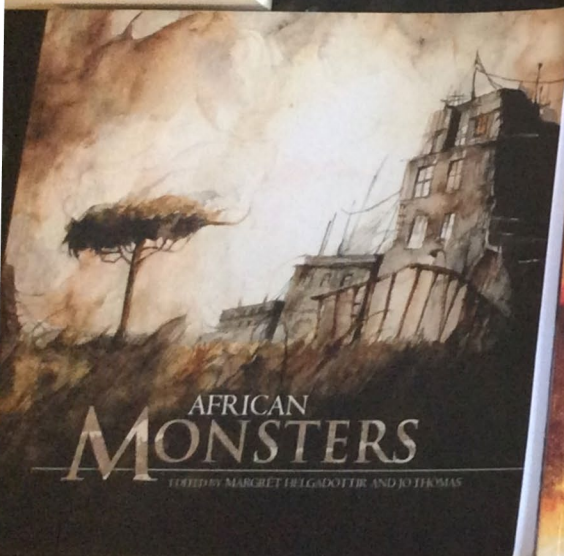

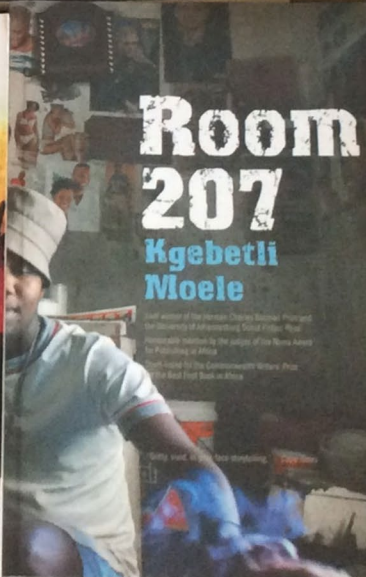
